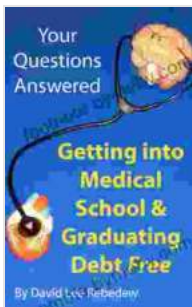

- Be yourself and be confident

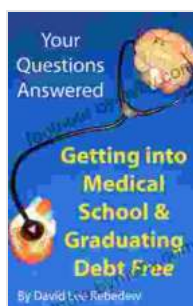

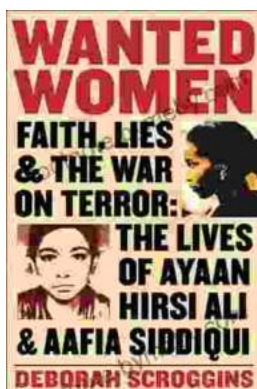
