

Rising from the Ashes of Genocide: A Survivor's Story

Immaculée Ilibagiza's story is one of unimaginable horror and unimaginable hope. In 1994, she was a young Tutsi woman living in Rwanda. When the

genocide broke out, she was forced to flee her home along with her family. They were hunted by Interahamwe militiamen, and Immaculée's parents and brothers were brutally murdered. She managed to escape and hide in a bathroom with seven other women for 91 days.

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
