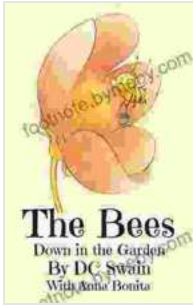

Simplicity, purity, cheerfulness, beginning</p>
 <p><b>Carnation</b> <i>Dianthus carophyllus</i> Some scholars believe it comes from "poppycock," as it was one of the flowers used for Greek ceremonial crowns. 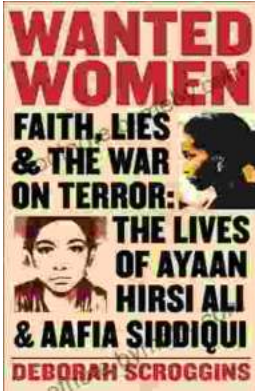

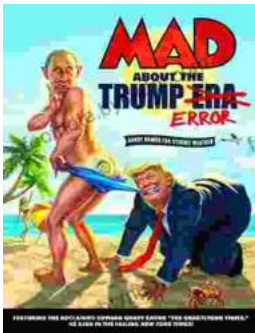
