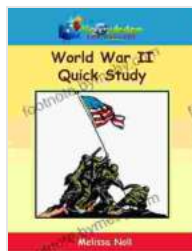

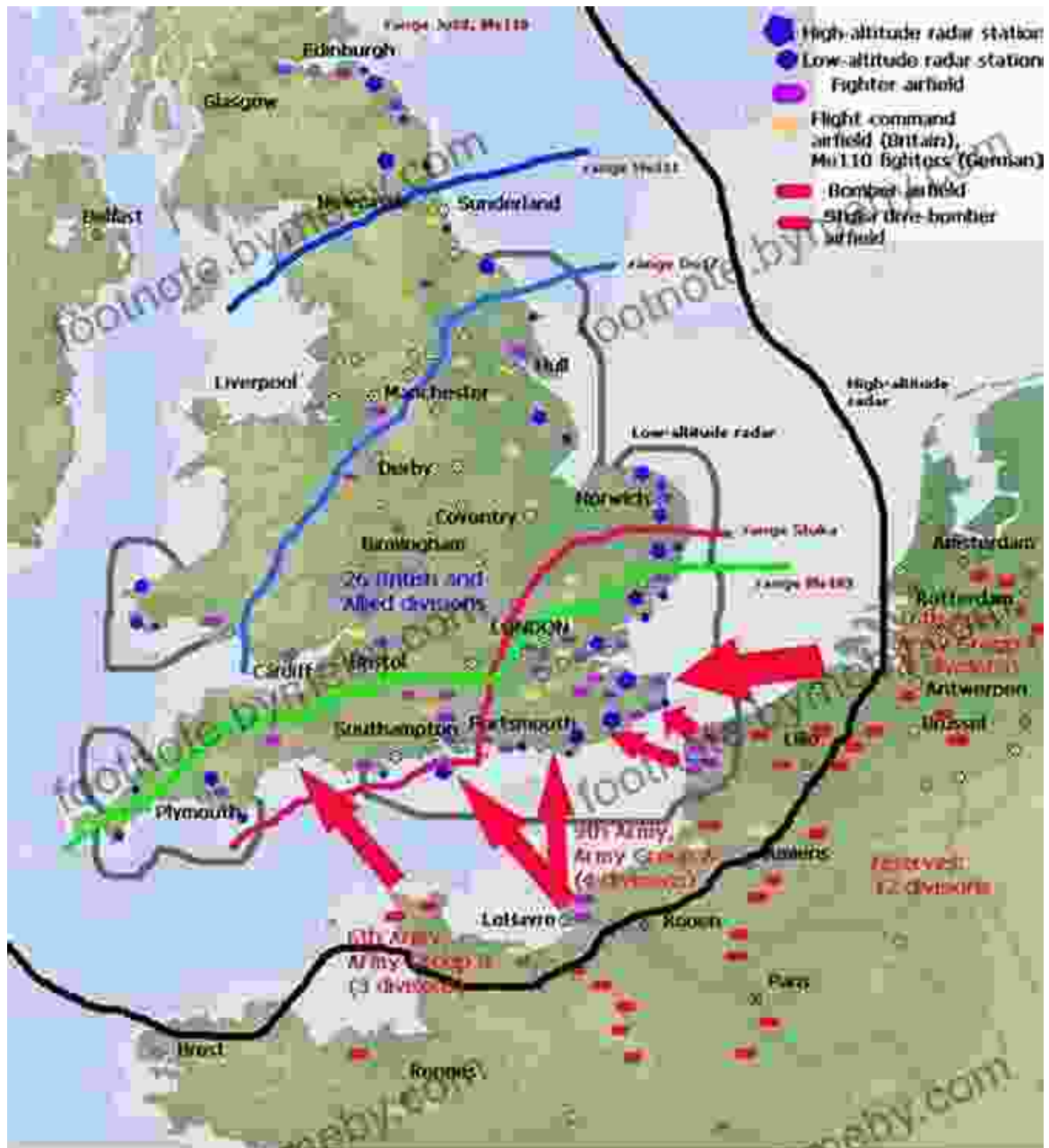

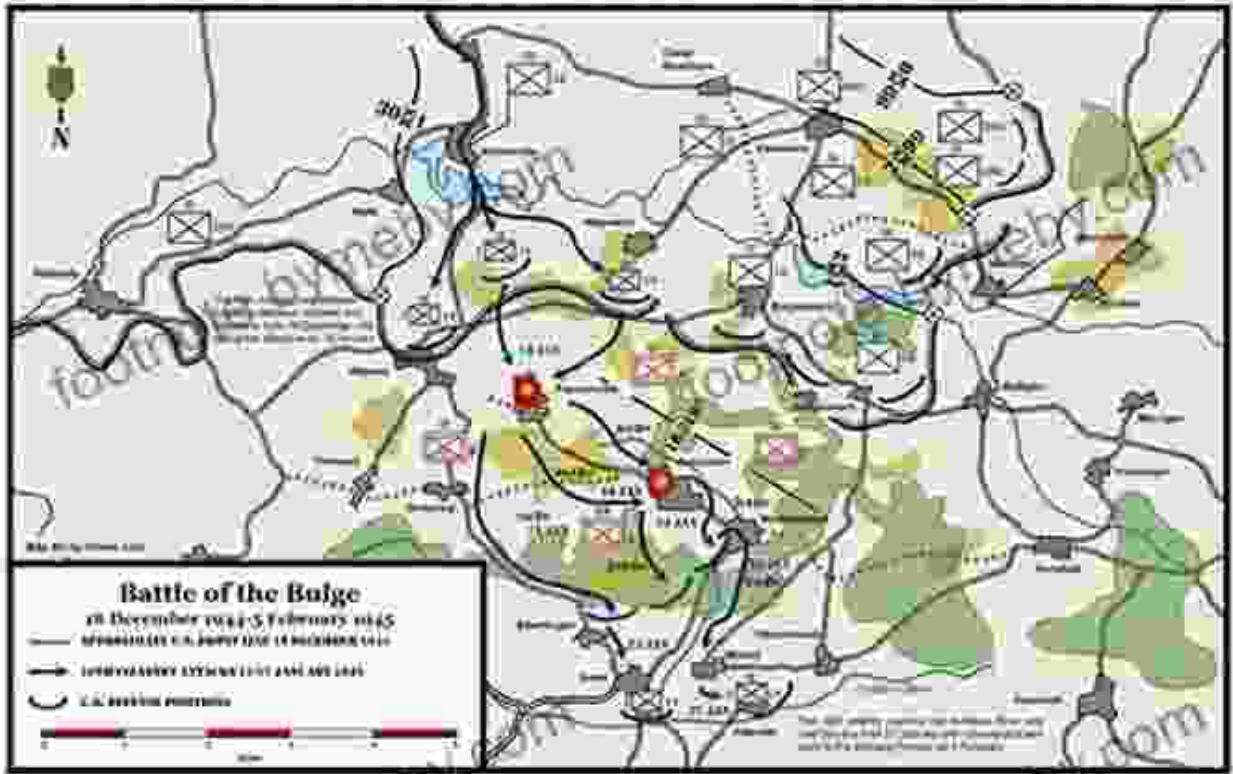


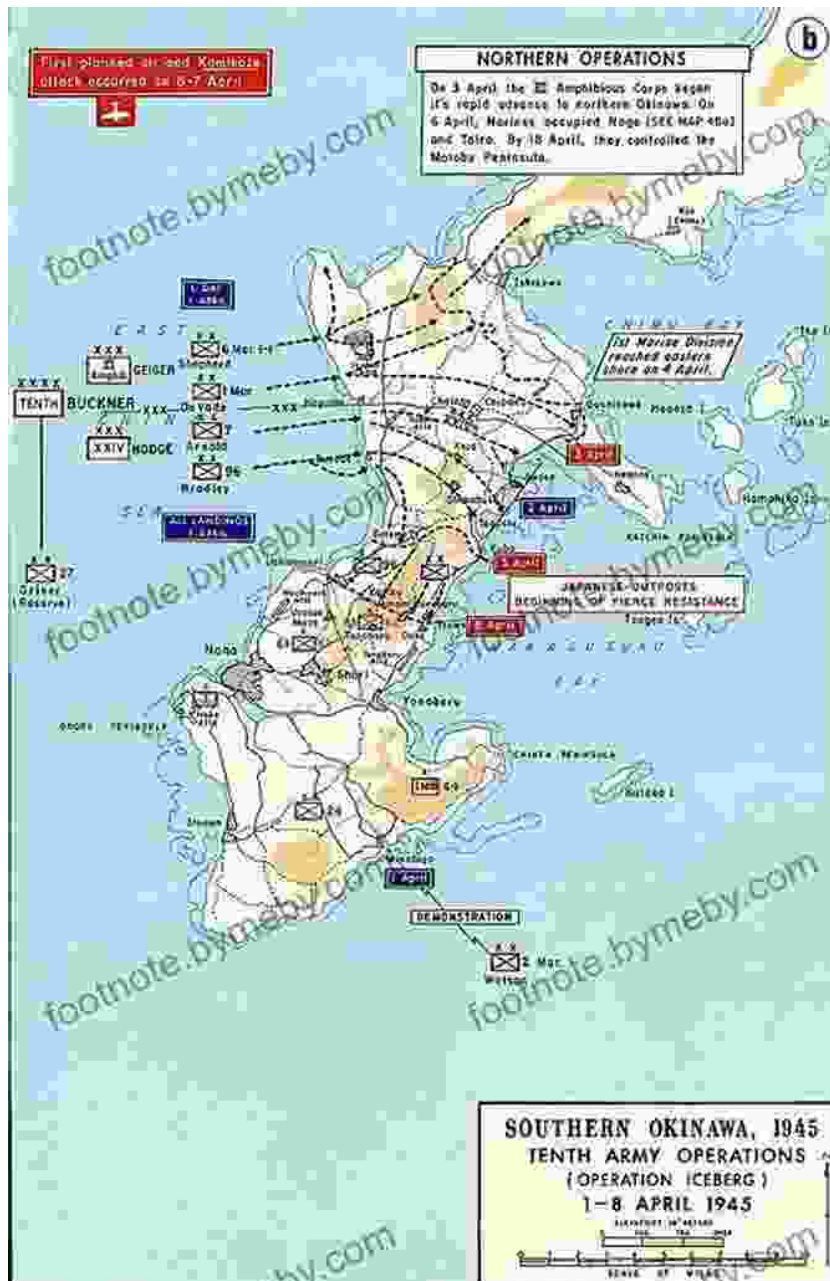


D-DAY LANDINGS

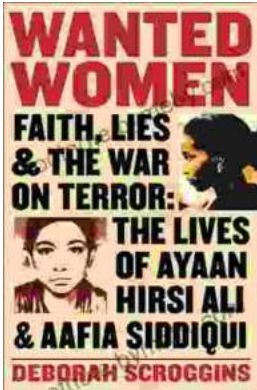
